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Setting up

Inserting a SIM card, microSD card, and the battery

A SIM card (not supplied) allows the phone to connect to a mobile phone service. Contact your network operator/service provider for more information.


A microSD card (not supplied) allows you to expand the phone's storage capabilities.

Important:

- When removing the battery, make sure you turn off the phone first.
- To avoid loss of data or malfunction, do not damage, carelessly handle, or short-circuit the gold-coloured contacts of the SIM card or microSD card.
- 1 Remove the phone's cover.





- 2 Open the SIM card cover by sliding it toward the nearest side of the phone (1) and then lifting up (2).
- 3 Put the SIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.





- 4 Close the SIM card cover (①), and then gently slide the cover toward the opposite side of the phone (②).
- 5 Open the microSD card cover by sliding it toward the nearest side of the phone (1) and then lifting up (2).
- 6 Put the microSD card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down, close the microSD card cover (①), and then gently slide the cover toward the opposite side of the phone (②).
- 7 Insert the battery (1) and lower it into the phone (2), then attach the cover (3).









Note:


- Use only the battery specified.
- Wipe the battery ends (\bigoplus , \bigcirc), SIM card, and microSD card with a dry cloth.
- Avoid touching the battery ends (\bigoplus , \bigcirc) or the unit contacts.
- After installing the SIM card, microSD card, and battery, press [>40] for about 2 seconds to turn the power on (page 10).


Battery charging

You can charge the battery by connecting the phone to a power outlet using the supplied AC adaptor, either directly or by using the charger, or by connecting it to a computer using a USB cable (not supplied).

- Charge for about 3 hours.
- Charging time and battery life might differ depending on the condition of the network.
- When using an AC adaptor, use only the supplied AC adaptor.
- When charging begins, the phone sounds and the battery indicator lights. When the battery is fully charged, the battery indicator turns off.

◆ AC adaptor or USB connection






Note:

Turning the power on/off

Press [* •] for about 2 seconds.

• The phone vibrates when you turn the power on.

Note:

- Enter the PIN1 code and press [] or [#] when the PIN1 code request is displayed (page 34).
- The display becomes dark when you do not operate the phone for about 1 minute. Press any key to turn the display back on.

Initial settings

The phone may prompt you to set display language, time zone, and date and time each time a new SIM card is installed.

Display font size

Press [+] or [-] to adjust the font size of displayed menus.

Note:

You cannot adjust the display font size while you are on a call or the phone is ringing for an
incoming call.

Changing the ringer tone

You can change the ringer tone by selecting one of the preset tones ("Using a preset ringer tone", page 11) or by selecting one of your own sound files (including sounds recorded using the phone'

s voice recorder) for use as a ringer tone ("Using your own sound file", page 11).

Using a preset ringer tone

- 1 Press (\blacktriangle). \rightarrow (\updownarrow): Select \blacktriangleright . \rightarrow (\frown)

Using your own sound file

Before you can use your own sound file as a ringer tone, you must first prepare it for use as a ringer tone.

For your safety

↑ WARNING

Power connection

- Use only the power source marked on the product.
- Do not overload power outlets and extension cords. This can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- Completely insert the AC adaptor into the power outlet. Failure to do so may cause electric shock and/or excessive heat resulting in a fire.
- Regularly remove any dust, etc. from the AC adaptor by pulling it from the power outlet, then
 wiping with a dry cloth. Accumulated dust may cause an insulation defect from moisture, etc.
 resulting in a fire.
- Unplug the product from power outlets and remove the battery from the phone if it emits smoke, an abnormal smell, or makes an unusual noise. These conditions can cause fire or electric shock. Confirm that smoke has stopped emitting and contact an authorised service centre.

Installation

- This product emits radio waves and may cause interference to other electronic devices.
- Do not allow the AC adaptor to be excessively pulled, bent or placed under heavy objects.
- To prevent serious damage to this product, avoid strong impacts and rough handling.
- To avoid damage or malfunction, do not modify the SIM card or microSD card or touch the card's gold-coloured contacts.

Battery

- Use only the battery specified.
- Risk of explosion if battery is replaced with an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries
 according to the instructions.
- Do not open, puncture, crush, or drop the battery. A damaged battery must not be used. This
 can result in the risk of fire, explosion, overheating, and leaking of the electrolyte.
- Stop using the battery immediately and keep away from fire if it emits an abnormal smell or leaks electrolyte. Released electrolyte may cause fire or burns.

- Do not touch released electrolyte if the battery leaks. It may cause burns or injury to the eyes

- Do not put magnetic substances close to the phone. Strong magnetism might affect operation.

SAR

This model meets international guidelines and EU requirements for exposure to radio waves. Your wireless device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed radio wave exposure limits recommended by international guidelines. Making calls

Call options

While talking, the following options are available by pressing [>]:

- "Mute On"/"Mute Off": turns the mute on/off.
- "Handsfree On"/"Handsfree Off": enables/disables handsfree.
- "Phonebook": views the contacts list.
- "Call Log": enters the call log menu (page 43).
- "Messages": enters the message menu (page 41).

Answering calls

When a call is being received, the incoming call indicator flashes rapidly (page 9).

- 1 Press () to answer.
 - To answer a call by opening the phone, see page 44.
 - To reject the call, press [> ()].
- 2 Press [★७] to end the call.

Note:

• This phone can announce the caller's phone number after every ring when a call is received. To use this feature, turn the caller ID readout feature on (page 47).

Missed calls

If a call is not answered, the phone treats it as a missed call.

"Missed Call" and the number of missed calls are shown on the display. You can view the missed call log by pressing [>] when it is displayed.

Call log

Incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are stored in a call log (maximum 10 calls each).

Note:

- When a caller's phone number matches a phone number stored in the contacts list, the stored name is displayed and logged.
 - "Unknown Number": The caller's information could not be received.
 - "Withheld": The caller requests not to send their phone number.

Call log options

Voicemail service

Listening to voicemail messages

- 1 Press and hold [1^w] when in standby mode.
- 2 Press (★Φ) to end the call.

Text input

Press the dial keys to input characters and numbers. Each dial key has multiple characters assigned to it. The assigned characters for each key will be displayed when you press the key.

Alarm

While the alarm is sounding, a text memo is displayed. A total of 5 separate alarm times can be programmed. The phone vibrates when the silent mode is on.

Priority call procedure

Security settings

PIN code

PIN1/PIN2 protects your SIM card against unauthorised use. When the PIN1 code request is on, you must enter the PIN1 code each time the phone is turned on.

- If you enter the incorrect PIN1/PIN2 code 3 times, the SIM card is locked. Enter the 8-digit PUK1 code for PIN1 or the 8-digit PUK2 code for PIN2 to unlock.
- If you enter the incorrect PUK1/PUK2 code 10 times, contact your network operator/service provider for further information.
- Both PIN/PUK numbers are issued by your network operator/service provider.
- The PIN1 code request cannot be set to "off" with some SIM card types.

Camera

You can take still pictures by activating the camera.

Note:

- When you close the phone while using camera mode, camera mode ends and the phone returns to standby mode.
- If line accumulates on the camera lens, images may become blurry. In this case, wipe the lens with a soft, dry cloth.

Taking a picture

The phone can capture images and save them in the "Photos" (Photos) folder in the selected memory location (page 36). For information about camera settings, see page 44.

 - Press [\(\frac{1}{2} \) to turn the light on when shooting in low light (page 7).
 - To zoom in or zoom out, press and hold (▲) or (▼).

 - The following options are available for 5 seconds after taking a picture.
 - "Send"
 - "Delete"
 - After taking pictures, press [\(\doc{\pi}\)] again to turn off the light (page 7).

Camera options

While using camera mode, the following options are available by pressing [>]:

- "Image Viewer": allows you to view saved images.
- "Camera Settings": allows you to customise the shutter sound, exposure ("EV"), and contrast, or configure a delay timer.
- "Image Settings": allows you to set image size and quality.
- "White Balance": allows you to change how colours are captured based on the lighting.
- "Scene Mode": offers night mode for shooting in dim light.
- "Effect Settings": offers photo effects as greyscale, sepia tones, or colour invert.
- "Storage": must be set to "Memory Card" if a memory card is inserted to save the pictures. If not, the pictures are saved to the phone.
- "Restore Default": resets your customised settings except for "Image Viewer" settings.

Image viewer

To view images taken with the phone's camera, you can activate the image viewer directly in standby mode without activating the camera.

 - Press and hold [1] to zoom into an image and [2] to zoom out. Some images may not be re-sizable.

If you view the saved files after deleting files, the files may not be sorted correctly.

Image viewer options

- "View": allows you to view saved images.
- "Image Information": shows the file name, saved date and time, file size, etc.

- "send": allows you to send the image file by MMS or Bluetooth data transfer.
- "Use as": allows you to use the image as wallpaper or caller picture for a contact.
- "Rename": allows you to edit the file name (page 21).
- "Delete": deletes the selected file.
